Tackies Jack Delahunty, 190 pounds, and Dan Popovich, 207; Guards Bill Troillinger, 188, and John Maguire, 180; and John Maguire, 180; and Center Bill Staniey, 220, are the leading linemen who will report to the varsity for the first time.
